

Rupert Ebner, Germany

Treasurer and board member, Slow Food Germany

Over the past 20 years, Rupert Ebner has been active as leader of the local group Slow Food Convivium Munich and since 2010 he is treasurer and board member of Slow Food Germany. Ebner is veterinarian and part of the

Green party. He is responsible for the environmental department in Ingolstadt. As a specialist for livestock and representative of Slow Food Germany, he is a renowned speaker and interview partner for the German media. He breeds one of German Ark of Taste passengers: the Bavarian "Murnau-Werdenfelser" cattle.



Deborah Klein Walker, United States

Past President, American Public Health Association

Deborah Klein Walker is an American honored public health leader and behavioral science researcher with a 40 years career. She is immediate president of the Global Alliance for Behavioral Health and Social Justice,

former president of the American Public Health Association and the Association of Maternal and Child Health, among others. She has specialized in maternal and child health, children with special health care needs, chronic disease prevention, disabilities, population health, early childhood systems and adolescent health. James Lomax is a tropical agriculturalist by training (MSc Reading University) and the Sustainable Food Systems and Agriculture Programme Management Officer in UN Environment's

Economy Division, since 2009. He leads work on mainstreaming sustainable consumption and production practices from 'farm to flush' in the agriculture and food sector. He has pioneered the idea of systems thinking in the food and agriculture sector where nutrition, waste, environ-mental externalities and livelihoods must be considered.



Jennifer Morgan, United States

Executive Director Greenpeace International

Jennifer Morgan, together with Bunny Mc Diarmid, became Executive Director of Greenpeace International as of 4 April 2016. She was the former Global Director of the Climate Program at the World Resources

Institute, Global Climate Change Director at Third Generation Environmentalism (E3G), and led the Global Climate Change Program of Worldwide Fund for Nature (WWF). Morgan holds a B.A. from Indiana University in Political Science and Germanic Studies, and a Master of Arts from the School of International Service at The American University in International Affairs. She is a member of Germany's Council for Sustainable Development and is based in Amsterdam, Netherlands.



Carsten Höting, Germany

Chef de cuisine, Mensa Rempartstraße

Carsten Höting is Chef de cuisine and manager of the canteen "Mensa Rempartstraße", one of the biggest canteens for colleges in Freiburg. He is responsible for about 3,000 meals to be served per day. He is a certified restaurateur and business

manager in the hotel sector and a chef. Bevor he joined Mensa Rempartstraße he was manager of several canteen kitchens.



Natascha Kooiman, Netherlands

Stephan Schindele, Germany

Research Project Agrophotovoltaics, Fraunhofer Institute for Energy Systems Freiburg

Stephan Schindele works at Fraunhofer Institute for Solar Energy Systems – ISE since 2010. He coordinates the project Agrophotovoltaics – Resource Efficient Land

Use (APV-RESOLA) and is doing his PhD at the Institute for Political Science, University of Tübingen, on the Innovation Processes of Agrophotovoltaics and their Political Steering. He is also a lecturer on Energy Policy at the Faculty of Technology, Reutlingen University.



Klaus Töpfer, Germany

Former Under Secretary General United Nations

Klaus Töpfer has been the patron of the International Convention of Environmental Laureates since it was first held in 2012. Töpfer is the former Director of the Institute for Advanced Sustainability Studies

(IASS) based in Potsdam. He is also the former Executive Director of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) and was German Federal Minister for the Environment, Nature Conservation and Nuclear Safety from 1987 to 1994. He is one of the leading and most renowned environmental experts in Germany and worldwide.



Mathis Wackernagel, Switzerland

CEO Global Footprint Network

Mathis Wackernagel is the co-creator of the Ecological Footprint and CEO of Global Footprint Network. This international think-tank focuses on bringing about a sustainable human economy in which all can thrive within the means of one planet.

Wackernagels' awards include the 2015 IAIA Global Environment Award, the 2012 Blue Planet Prize, the 2012 Binding-Prize for Nature Conservation, the 2012 Kenneth E. Boulding Memorial Award, the 2011 Zayed International Prize for the Environment, an honorary doctorate from the University of Berne, and a Skoll Award for Social Entrepreneurship.



Oana Elena Stürz, Germany

Project Manager Engineering, Pfizer

Oana Elena Stürz joined Pfizer in 2015 as a project Manager. She is responsible for engineering projects related to building services, production extension and rebuilding. She is also technical representative for quality affairs. In 2016 she obtained

the title of Energy Manager after passing the examination for the "Energiemanagement-Beauftragter (EnMB) Tüv Süd". She has passion for energy-efficient technologies, environmental topics and sustainability. She studied Energy Conversion and Management and got the degree Master of Science in Chemical and Process Engineering.



Ernst Ulrich von Weizsäcker, Germany

Ernst Ulrich von Weizsäcker is Co-President of the Club of Rome. He was Co-Chair of the International Resource Panel. Von Weizsäcker was founding president of the Wuppertal Institute for Climate, Environment and Energy. He worked as professor

for Biology; also he was the founding president of the University of Kassel. Von Weizsäcker has been a member of the German Parliament, SPD for seven years. He was Chairman of the Bundestag Study Commission on Economic Globalisation.



Sarah Wiener, Austria

Chef, author and founder of the Sarah Wiener Foundation

Sarah Wiener is an Austrian (TV-) chef and sustainability icon who advocates for preserving natural resources and an ethical and ecological awareness regarding nutrition. She runs a successful catering com-

pany, a restaurant with exclusively regional suppliers, and an organic wood stove bakery. She believes in closing the circle from field to plate, and owns together with partners an organic farm near Berlin. Wiener campaigns for several causes (Cradle to Cradle and ambassador for biological diversity) and with her Sarah Wiener Foundation, she aims to inspire children to eat good and versatile foods.

Karen Aghababyan has completed his PhD in Biology in 2001. He was working in the Institute of Zoology of Armenian NAS until 2003, and works in the environmental research center of American University of Armenia up to present. He is the National Coordinator in Armenia of "European Breeding Bird Atlas 2", an expert of two national foundations and IUCN SSC. He has received 20 grants, one scholarship, and one award. He has published over 50 papers and is a co-author of two books.



Nyanda Ashililya

Nvanda Ashililva lives and works in the Misungwi District of the Mwanza Region of Tanzania. She is the Director of the Mwanza Rural Housing Program (NGO). She is a planner and strategist specialized in rural development and always believing in sustainability. She owns a M.A. degree in Environmental Planning from the University of Nottingham, England. She received the 1st African ASHDEN Award for her projects in the field of alternative energy. Her work was also recognized by UN HABITAT in 2007.



Purnima Devi Barman India Wildlife biologist, Aaranyak NGO Whitley Awards

Purnima Devi Barman, also known as "Hargila baido"/Stork sister among her colleagues, is a wildlife biologist in Aaranyak and a crusader for conservation of the highly endangered Greater Adjutant Stork (Leptoptilos dubius). She has been rewarded many times for her initiatives and is a member of the global women in Nature Network. Her work also includes giving biodiversity classes in local village schools, as well as empowering community women.

Dipal Chandra Barua was the Founding Managing Director of Grameen Shakti and the Co-Founder & Former Deputy Managing Director of Grameen Bank. Back in 1996, he has introduced an innovative financial model which has made Solar Home System affordable to the rural people at the price of kerosene. He is replacing currently used traditional hazardous diesel pumps with solar powered irrigation pumps in the remote areas of Bangladesh, which reduces dependency on weather and grid electricity.

Heide Bergmann is an educator and gardener based in Freiburg where she co-founded the Oekostation Freiburg in 1986. The Oekostation is an educational center for sustainable development which is supported by the BUND (Friends of the Earth Germany). In 1987 she initiated the Green Classroom for schools and kindergartens. In addition, she teaches workshops, gives lectures and writes books on organic gardening, on how to grow an herb garden and on gardening with children.



Claus Biegert Germany Presenter, The Nuclear-Free Future Award

Claus Biegert is a freelance writer, radio journalist, film maker and book author. Since 1973 he has intensive collaborations with Native Americans in Canada and the United States. Biegert is lecturer at the German School of Journalism, Advisory Board Member of the Society for Threatened Peoples, Founder of the World Uranium Hearing (1992) and since 1998 director of the Nuclear-Free Future Award.



Erika Blank Germany Presenter, Environmental Media Prize

Erika Blank works since 30 years at Environmental Action Germany DUH for projects that can be supported by the Hand in Hand-Fund. She is also in charge of the arrangement of the DUH (Deutschen Umwelthilfe) Environmental Media Prize since 1988.

Oleg Bodrov is an engineerphysicist and environmentalist. From 1980 till 1993 he was head of a group of the Regional Ecological Laboratory of the Khlopin Radium Institute, St. Petersburg. Since 2005 he has been one of the initiators and head of an international NGO project for the promotion of safe decommissioning of the Russian nuclear power plants and final disposal of the radioactive waste, spending nuclear fuel on the basis of the best international practice.

Since 1997 she presides a trinational umbrella NGO for alpine protection in cooperation with the Alpine Convention, IUCN, UNESCO, CIPRA and the Mountain Partnership.

Sabine Fesenmayr is head of the Yves Rocher Foundation in Germany since 1994. She is responsible for the implementation of all its programs in Germany. She worked for the Yves Rocher Foundation reforestation programme "Plant for the planet: 100 million trees". 


